And there's some feeling of frustration at having written several of these reports and having spoken numerous times

urging, BEGGING for more volunteer participation, and hearing only a murmur of good intentions in response. There is no doubt that some of the blame for the lack of response is the lack of direction for volunteerism. "We don't care what you do, just do something" could be a tough challenge. . . so I've thought that it might be time to give some direction to the request, plant some ideas about just what sort of interest and action is needed by the MWPCA.

The weak spots in the MWPCA fabric are where we need some volunteer patches and stitches to help us out.

1. MWPCA sorely needs someone who is interested in government affairs, someone who is eager and willing to pay attention

to what is happening on Beacon Hill and in Washington that might affect operators and the work that they do; someone who's willing to lead the charge for better professional recognition, higher infrastructure funding, and more practical and friendly regulatory adjustments; someone who's willing to get out the vote and organize the letter-writing when tough issues for the industry are being considered. Some people have offered to be "foot soldiers" in this effort - we just need a colonel to lead the effort.

2. MWPCA needs some people who would like to influence the content of our quarterly meeting programs and seminars, and who would like to have a say in the training that is made available to the operator profession through the work of the MWPCA. For most folks, the quarterly meeting programs "just happen," but there's a good deal of work and arrangement that goes into developing a program. Our Program Chair has been handling the brunt of this activity for years, but he needs help - your help; and he is looking for someone to take over the chair, and to inject some fresh ideas into the process. If you'd like to influence the choice of material and presenters, we need you to step forward.

3. MWPCA needs someone who can reinforce the message of safe working practices through the presentation of articles, quizzes, and stories in the newsletter and at meetings and seminars - if you like talking safety, a seat on the Safety Committee, or even the Chair of it, is waiting for you step forward.

4. MWPCA could really use someone to carry the MWPCA message to outlets beyond this newsletter and our own web page, to publicize our efforts and concerns in places where the general public can note it and even help support our causes. If you like to write, and if you have knowledge of local and regional news outlets or would like to develop that knowledge, the MWPCA has an opportunity for you to make some progress.

FOLLOWING GRACE MEETING, NON-MEMBERS TO PAY DUES TO ATTEND - Ray Willis

At the March 2008 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board discussed and voted to approve a change to the fee structure for non-members attending MWPCA-sponsored quarterly meetings and/or specialty conferences. Based on the new structure, a non-member will be allowed to attend an MWPCA sponsored event one time at the non-member rate, which is typically \$5 more than the member rate to attend meetings. After this one-time grace meeting, the cost for a non-member to attend an MWPCA-sponsored event will include the cost for an annual membership to MWPCA, including

automatic enrollment as an MWPCA member. This change is intended to offset the current inequity for members (based on the current fee structure, the non-member "penalty" for all four quarterly meetings would not even amount to the annual membership fee paid by our loyal members).

In addition, the new policy supports one of our goals as Directors; to find ways to expand the membership base in order to further advance the benefits

that MWPCA provides to its members. As a non-profit organization, we rely heavily on membership fees, for example: to offset the costs of meetings that are critical in providing training contact hours (TCH); to provide a quarterly newsletter in order to inform members of changes and advances in the wastewater treatment profession; to sponsor operators to attend the NEWEA conference; and to help defray the costs associated with the operator exchange

May 2008 Wastewater Certification Exam

484 applicants took the Massachusetts Wastewater Operators Certification Exam in May. The passing rates are as follows:
